Visiting Heritage Sites and National Parks

● **Observing Hours:** Adhering to designated visiting hours ensures a seamless experience and supports site management.

● **Entrance Fees:** Visitors must pay authorized entrance fees, documented with their respective ticket.

● **Registration:** Completing entry control procedures, such as signing visitor lists, helps manage site visits effectively.

- **Path Use:** Using designated paths provided at destinations contributes to site preservation.
- **Preventing Pollution:** Please use designated waste disposal areas to avoid contamination.
- **Food and Drinks:** Visitors should consult guides before bringing snacks or drinks to prevent environmental contamination.
- **Monument Care:** Protecting and preserving site monuments and structures is a shared responsibility.
- **Flora and Fauna:** Preserving local biodiversity is vital. Please refrain from damaging or extracting plants and animals.
- **Alcohol and Narcotics:** The entry of alcohol or narcotics is strictly prohibited, as is visiting under their influence.
- **Authorized Activities:** Only authorized sports activities are allowed in archaeological sites and national parks.
- **No Advertising:** Placing ads or commercial materials within sites is not permitted.
- **Sound Equipment:** Entry of sound equipment requires authorization from the Ministry of Culture.
- **Pet Restriction:** For the preservation of the archaeological sites, please note that pets are not allowed.
- **Gifts Prohibition:** Offering gifts to site personnel is discouraged to ensure unbiased experiences.
- **No Smoking:** Smoking is prohibited within site areas to prevent environmental damage.
- **Firearm Restriction:** Firearms are not allowed within archaeological sites and national parks.
- **Authorized Hours:** Visitors should respect site operating hours unless authorized by the National Institute of Culture.
